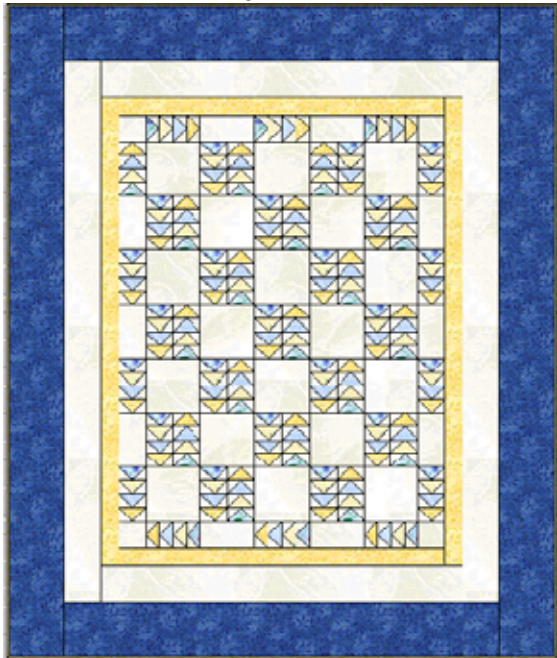


Forest Quilting

Flying Geese Quilt

60.5 by 72.5 inches



Use quilt image for layout

Center Quilt Blocks

48 – 3.5 x 6.5 inch Flying Geese blocks (finished 3x6 inch)

10 – white 3.5 x 6.5 blocks (finished 3x6 inch)

18 – white 6.5 square inch block

4 – white 3.5 inch square blocks (finished 3 inch square)

Yellow border

2 – 2.5 inches by 40 inches (bottom & top with trim allowance)

2 – 2.5 inches by 55 inches (sides with trim allowance)

White border

2 – 4.5 inches by 45 inches (bottom and top with trim allowance)

2 – 4.5 inches by 64 inches (sides with trim allowance)

Blue border

2 – 6.5 inches by 52 inches (bottom and top with trim allowance)

2 – 6.5 inches by 75 inches (sides with trim allowance)

Yellow binding (double fold, quarter inch)

Bias cut about 290 inches of 2.5 inch bias strips. See the link below for great instructions on cutting bias strips.

**Note a 36 inch square of fabric will yield over 500 inches of 2.5 inch bias strips.

Batting

Twin size batting (72 x 90 inches)

Backing

I like to have about 5 inches of extra backing on all sides of the quilt when I machine quilt.

Without extra (63 inches by 75 inches) - 45" wide fabric = 3.5 yards (horizontal seam); 108 inch wide fabric = 1.75 yards (no seam)

With extra (71 inches by 83 inches) – 45" wide fabric = 4 yards (vertical seam); 108" wide fabric = 2 yards (no seams)

Standard Bed and Batting Sizes

	Mattress size	Batting Size
Bed size	(width x length)	(width x length)
Crib	23" x 46"	45" x 60"
Twin	39" x 75"	72" x 90"
Double (or Full)	54" x 75"	81" x 96"
Queen	60" x 80"	90" x 108"
King	76" x 80"	120" x 120"
