These instructions are not detailed and assume you have sewing experience.

Requires a variety of small pieces of fabric. Using a variety of types of fabrics (cotton, poly, flannel, minky, or knit) adds texture and interest. Adding crinkly tags might add interest for infants. Be creative!!

Use fusible interfacing to attach elements of the stuffie. I used fusible interfacing on the eye outline, eyes, and nose. Either zigsag or straight stitch along raw edges. Do free-motion or straight stitching around eyes in black thread to add drama.

Fuse the eye outline on the front.

Layer the belly on top of that.

Fuse noses and eyes on to the front; finish edges as desired.

Sew right side of the wings together and turn right sides out. Pin stitch the raw edges of the wings to the side of the owl. Wings are sewn onto sides, but not attached in the front.

Optional: Add stuffed skinny legs. I made mine with  $1 \frac{1}{2}$  by  $3 \frac{1}{2}$  rectangles of fabric. Add tuff of yarn/fur to the head. Sew these unto the front.

Secure the right sides of the back and front together making sure the wings, legs, and tuff are tucked in.

Sew around the perimeter leaving a 1 1/5 to 2 inch space open to allow for turning the owl right side out.

Turn the owl right side out and stuff with a fill of your choice. Hand sew the opening close.
