Play with the basic motifs to create larger blocks and border designs.



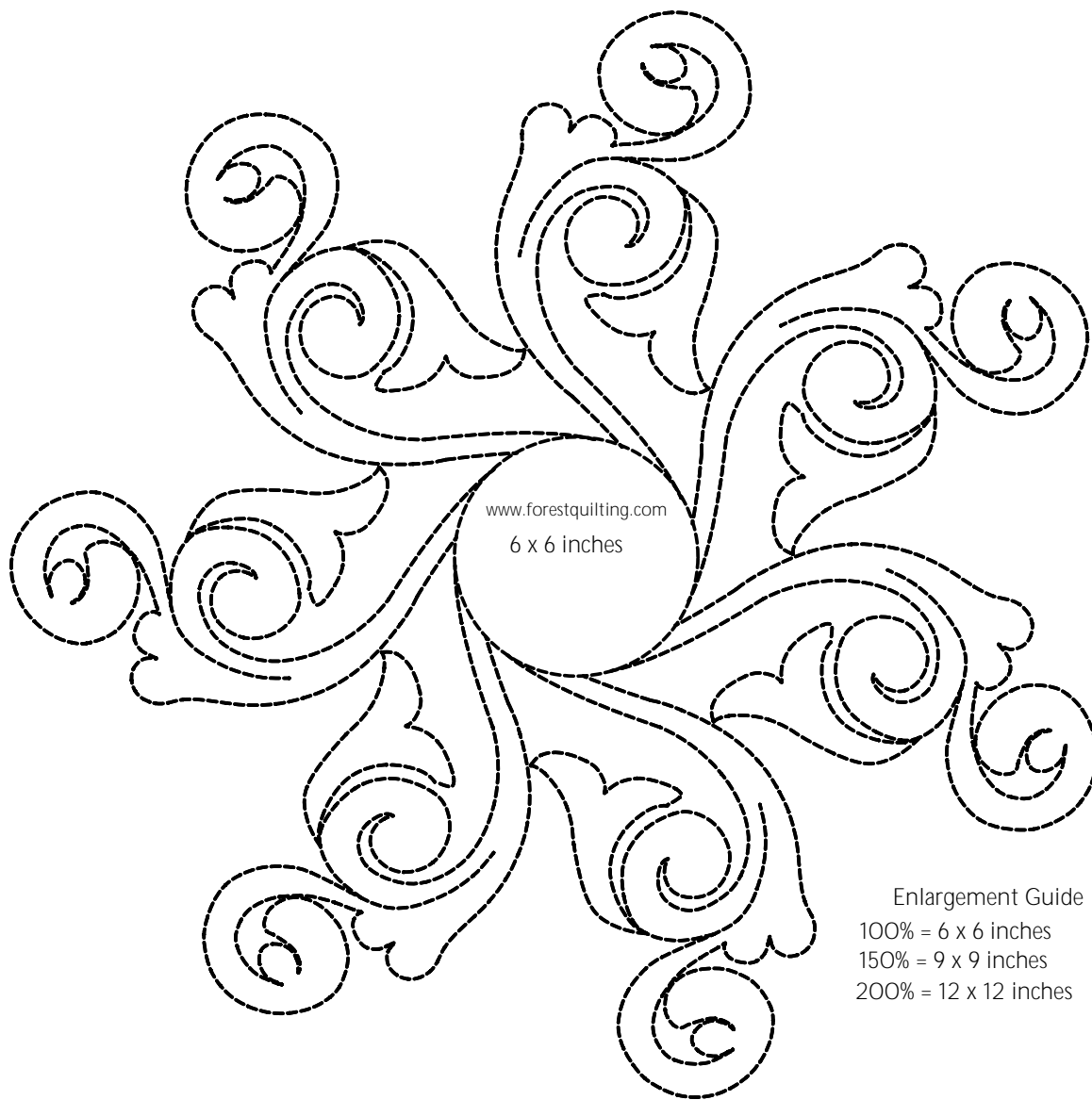
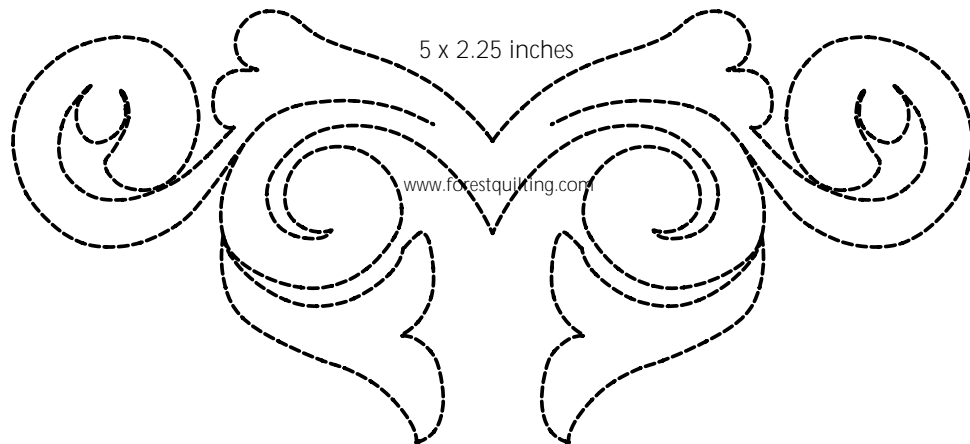
